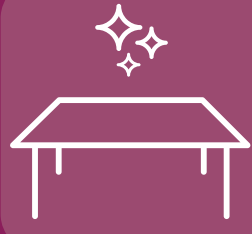


Staying Safe in our Podiatry Clinic

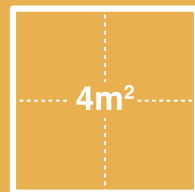
What we're doing...

We want to keep you safe in the clinic. We regularly clean surfaces that people touch, such as tables, door handles and computer keyboards.

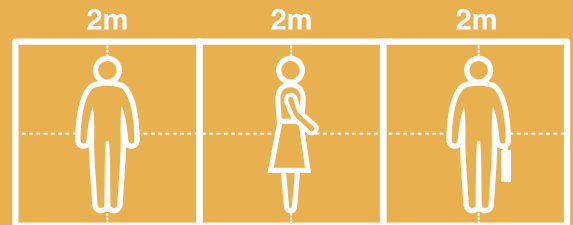


Stay 2 metres apart...

Covid-19 is most likely to spread by being near to a person while they are infectious. This includes touching objects or surfaces that they have coughed or sneezed on and then touching your mouth or face. The more space you create between you or other people, the harder it is for the virus to spread. There should be on average no more than one person per 4 square metres of floor space to reduce the risk whilst in this clinic.



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Keep other people safe...



Stay at home if you are feeling unwell.



Try not to touch other people.



Regularly wash your hands thoroughly and use hand sanitiser.



Cough or sneeze into your elbow – not into your hands.
